### Runners Unite! Care for Our Bodies and Care for the World

Church people are very good at looking after others. They give time and energy to the church, to their families, to their communities and to pretty much anyone in need. The problem is, sometimes they're not so good at looking after themselves. They get tired and worn out. But what if they could do something for themselves at the same time as doing something for others?

The Maritime Conference Stewardship Committee wants to offer you the chance to care for yourself while caring for the world.
