The second Presbyterian church in Halifax to acquire a pipe organ (after St Matthew's — when?) was Fort Massey's Tobin Street neighbour and friendly rival, St Andrew's auld kirk. Their organ was inaugurated to great acclaim on Sunday, 3 February 1884. Eight months later, on 23 October, the Morning Chronicle announced that Fort Massey, not to be outdone, "is getting an elaborate organ from Boston, which will be the first for that edifice." It was heard for the first time on Sunday, 23 November.
