# HERITAGE MOMENT By Barry Cahill

The trend towards theological controversy in public lecturing, which had begun in Halifax in November 1883, persisted into 1884. Dr Burns threw himself into it with characteristic vigour. The fourth in his winter series of lectures, "Review of the principal points in Bishop Cameron's last series of letters," was delivered in Fort Massey's lecture room on 14 March, and challenged the Roman Catholic Bishop of Arichat, John Cameron, on the subject of papal infallibility. The audience was "respectable" rather than large. Probably lectures on such obscure subjects were more popular with the lecturing clergy than with the average lecture-goer. Dr Burns not only waived the fifteen-cent price of admission, but also promised a second and concluding lecture on related subjects a week hence.
