HERITAGE MOMENT By Barry Cahill

An inspiring example of Fort Massey's sympathetic engagement with the wider world occurred at the General Assembly meeting in Montreal in early June 1885. Our own Dr Burns, one of the commissioners, moved a substantive and eloquent resolution expressing The Presbyterian Church in Canada's "profound sorrow" at the insurrection, then still in progress, of First Nations and Métis people in what is now Saskatchewan against the Canadian government. Suppression of the "Northwest Rebellion" led to the trial for treason, conviction and execution by hanging, on 16 November, of Louis Riel.

Out of the Cold Ministries Update from Peter and Stephanie

Many thanks for your constant and steady support with Out of the Cold donations this past year. Sadly, there have been changes at OTC. Our navigator Campbell and his partner resigned their positions in early summer and have not been replaced. Campbell spent an afternoon with Peter and I and his recount of the situation and events was sobering. A recent check-in confirmed there is no OTC support presently for the tent communities. OTC staff are in fact not allowed to offer food, showers, clothing and camping gear to them. Apparently, the OTC program is under review by community services. We will remove our OTC donation bin, and perhaps your donations can be directed to Brunswick St Mission, Phoenix House or a similar program.

We pray for our homeless neighbours and that good decisions be made by our city and provincial elected officials to help them. Many thanks - Peter and Stephanie
