HERITAGE MOMENT By Barry Cahill

In 1887 Canadian Thanksgiving Day fell on Friday, 18 November, and was observed in the Halifax churches. At morning service in Fort Massey Dr Burns' discourse bore on the question whether the glory of the British Empire and Canada may yet issue in "ruin and decay." That was the title of Burns' "powerful Thanksgiving sermon," which was published the next day on the front page of the Morning Chronicle. His text was Proverbs 14:34 ("Righteousness exalteth a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people").
