HERITAGE MOMENT By Barry Cahill

In February 1887 the presbyteries of Montreal, Toronto, Ottawa, Halifax and Miramichi unanimously nominated Dr Burns to be moderator of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. His election was confirmed on 9 June at the thirteenth General Assembly, held in Winnipeg. Burns was the only one of our ministers to become moderator while serving as pastor of Fort Massey. "The new moderator's eloquent address" was printed verbatim in the Evening Chronicle of 16 June, and from it we learn that Dr Burns was ordained to the ministry of word and sacrament on 1 July 1847, age just 21.
