HERITAGE MOMENT By Barry Cahill

Dr Burns was never one to steer clear of sectarian theological controversy. At evening service on Sunday, 8 January 1888, he backhandedly observed the golden jubilee of the ordination to the priesthood of Pope Leo XIII by preaching on "Peter's Primacy," his text being Matthew 16:18 ("Thou art Peter, and on this rock I will build my church.") According to Dr Burns, St Peter was a "thoroughly good Protestant." He spoke for over a hour and his sermon was afterwards printed in part on the front page of the Morning Chronicle. Otherwise, January 1888 was not a good month for Dr Burns; on the 18th he slipped and fell on snow-covered ice outside the manse on Kent Street, breaking his left wrist.
