HERITAGE MOMENT By Barry Cahill

According to a reputable secondary source, Dr Burns suffered a stroke on 1 January 1892. In mid-January he was reported as showing "symptoms of steady improvement." But in March he was forced to retire from the pulpit. The adjourned annual meeting of Fort Massey, on 17 February, learned that, acting on medical advice, Burns would tender his resignation at the next meeting of Halifax Presbytery. Fort Massey provided him an annuity of \$500 and designated him pastor emeritus, an altogether unique honour. The Burns family left Halifax in mid-April "for a prolonged sojourn in Scotland," which ended with his death in 1896. Few ministers of Fort Massey have served longer — seventeen years — or had a greater impact both within and outside the congregation. Robert Ferrier Burns was a gift to The Presbyterian Church in Canada, which came into existence three months after his induction to Fort Massey.


Say It with Stars
