

HERITAGE MOMENT By Barry Cahill

As a writer and lecturer Dr Burns was best known in Halifax as a pamphleteer and commentator on current affairs. But before he came to Fort Massey, while he was still minister at Cote des Neiges church in Montreal, he published in 1872 one great book: "The Life and Times of Rev. Robert Burns" (1789-1869), who was among the founders of the Free Church of Scotland in Canada. At 462 pages, Burns's biography of his father and namesake is a remarkable achievement.
