We have the Order of Fort Massey to honour those of our members who have conspicuously distinguished themselves in service to the congregation. What of those who became famous for their actions in the wider world? A case in point is the African explorer, William Grant Stairs (1863-1892), who attended Fort Massey Academy and grew up in Fort Massey Church. Having joined the British Army (Royal Engineers), he accompanied Henry Morton Stanley's expedition into Equatorial Africa in July 1887 to rescue Emin Pasha.
