

HERITAGE MOMENT by Barry Cahill

Fort Massey's difficult search for a new minister continued into October 1892. We read in the Morning Chronicle, "A meeting of Fort Massey Presbyterian congregation was held last night [12 October] at the close of the prayer meeting, to consider the question of calling a pastor. There was a good deal of discussion of a general character, and finally two names were proposed — Rev. R. E. Knowles and Rev. C. B. Pitblado [formerly minister of Chalmers, Halifax]. On a vote being taken, a small majority appeared for the former. Less than half of the enrolled membership of the congregation, however, voted. The elders refrained from voting, not wishing to influence the members in any way. It was resolved to ask presbytery to grant moderation in a call and Rev. Dr Currie, moderator of the session, and Rev. Dr Forrest were appointed commissioners to presbytery for that purpose."

Why do we encourage name tags be worn?

In a spirit of **radical welcome**, we encourage **everybody** to wear a name tag today. **Name tags** help us recognize and remember each other.

They are a small gesture appreciated by those learning many names at once; those who are deaf or hard of hearing; or those who struggle to match names with faces.

If you are **comfortable** doing so, consider adding your **pronouns**. Sharing **pronouns** is a signal that we welcome those of **all genders** and we appreciate knowing how to speak of each other **respectfully**.

Guest Preacher

We are delighted to welcome Rev. Dr. Rob Fennell as our guest preacher today. Dr. Fennell is Associate Professor of Historical and Systematic Theology at the Atlantic School of Theology. He hails from Winnipeg, is a graduate of Emmanuel College, (MDiv), and, University of St. Andrews, (MLitt), and the University of Toronto, (ThD). Rob's research interests include pilgrimage, hermeneutics, the Holy Spirit, C.S. Lewis, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, evangelism, congregational vitality, leadership, and The United Church of Canada. He is founding director of Camino Nova Scotia, AST's social enterprise-based summer pilgrimage program. Prior to serving with AST, he served as a minister with local congregations of The United Church of Canada.

Something New

During the Easter season (the 50 days following Easter Sunday) we will be experimenting with some new elements to our worship service. Here's what you can expect.

The Lord's Prayer: Each week we will speak together a different paraphrase of the Lord's Prayer. The beauty of the traditional translation lies in its familiarity, how the words roll off the tongue, how we can go into places of worship around the world and hear the familiarity of the same words spoken. Language is a powerful tool in shaping our minds and hearts. By interspersing contemporary translations with the traditional we can become aware of new insights, and our hearts can be opened in new ways. We might hear nuances in the prayer that otherwise would remain hidden. You are urged to pay attention to which paraphrases resonate with you, which ones make you bristle, which ones open new questions.

Silence: From time to time we will introduce more extended periods of silence and quiet reflection into the worship service. This might be woven in after the sermon or as part of our regular prayers, perhaps when we light the candle. So much of our lives is filled with words, with an outward focus. Silence holds the potential for us to hear the calling of God on our lives in ways that words cannot.
