

HERITAGE MOMENT by Barry Cahill

Since we have dispensed with reciting the Creed during divine service, it seemed appropriate to turn the clock back a century to when different views prevailed. At evening worship on Sunday, 17 February 1924, the Reverend Dr Clarence Mackinnon, principal of Presbyterian College and future last moderator of the undivided Presbyterian Church in Canada, addressed a large audience at Fort Massey on the "Authority of the Creed": "In all creeds there were inadequate expressions and those which had now become unintelligible showed a deficiency of faith in treating of the relation of God to man. It would be folly to obliterate the sun because there were spots on it ... but it would be equally as foolish to repudiate creeds because of their defects, these to be remedied through revision. As a reason why man did not have an infallible creed, ... spiritual knowledge is a growing thing and Christianity is not a creed."

🧒 Something New 🧒

During the Easter season (the 50 days following Easter Sunday) we will be experimenting with some new elements to our worship service. Here's what you can expect.

The Lord's Prayer: Each week we will speak together a different paraphrase of the Lord's Prayer. The beauty of the traditional translation lies in its familiarity, how the words roll off the tongue, how we can go into places of worship around the world and hear the familiarity of the same words spoken. Language is a powerful tool in shaping our minds and hearts. By interspersing contemporary translations with the traditional we can become aware of new insights, and our hearts can be opened in new ways. We might hear nuances in the prayer that otherwise would remain hidden.

You are urged to pay attention to which paraphrases resonate with you, which ones make you bristle, which ones open new questions.

Silence: From time to time we will introduce more extended periods of silence and quiet reflection into the worship service. This might be woven in after the sermon or as part of our regular prayers, perhaps when we light the candle. So much of our lives is filled with words, with an outward focus. Silence holds the potential for us to hear the calling of God on our lives in ways that words cannot.
