Heritage Moment by Barry Cahill

Dr Burns left big shoes to fill. According to the Morning Chronicle of Thursday, 18 August 1892 ("Fort Massey's Vacant Pulpit"), "A congregational meeting was held in connection with the prayer meeting in Fort Massey Presbyterian Church last night to discuss the question of calling a pastor. The proceedings were of an informal character, chiefly for the purpose of eliciting an expression of opinion. Three names were suggested to the meeting and after a vote had been taken, showing considerable diversity of opinion, it was unanimously resolved to adjourn — the date of a future meeting to be fixed by the session and managers. In the course of a month or six weeks it is expected that a fuller meeting can be had, and the congregation will probably be able to decide with practical unanimity as to whom they should call."
